#### Finding a Wife

Don't get a wife for my son from the Canaanites; get one from my family from my country.

What if she's not willing to come?

Don't take my son back there.

YHVH promised me and my descendants this land.

YHVH will send His angel before you.

If the woman will not follow, you are released from this oath; only do not take my son back there.

So the servant put his hand under the thigh of Abraham his master, and swore to him concerning this matter.

Rebekah expressed weariness to Isaac over Esau's wives. Isaac told Jacob not to take a wife from Canaan but to go find a wife from the daughters of Laban his mother's brother.

Fall of Babylon – to a nation from the north.

Yeshua's mission was to seek and to save (rescue from death) that which was lost...specifically the **lost sheep of Israel** (Luke 19:10; Matthew 15:24) but he did help a few outside the covenant (Matthew 15:21-28)

The Father sent a servant to find/bring a wife for his son. In Isaac's case, he sent his son Jacob to find a wife for himself. In Yeshua's case, the Father sent Him to find *His* lost wife (See also Hosea 3:1-3).

Yeshua's main ministry was primarily in Galilee; but, he did send his disciples and 70 others to the **lost sheep** of the house of Israel to bring them back into the covenant (Luke 9:1-6; 10:1-12).

Later, others were sent to bring the Gentiles into the covenant.

#### John 4:10-15

In Hebrew, **mayim chayyim (literally, living water)** means running water from a stream or spring, in contrast with water stored in a cistern. Figuratively, with Yeshua, it means spiritual life; compare 7:37-39.

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#### **Identities revealed**

Abraham's servant asked whose daughter Rebekah was and if there was room to lodge. She answered that she was Bethuel's daughter, Milcah's son, whom she bore to **Nahor.** We have both straw and feed enough, and room to lodge. Then the man bowed down his head and worshiped YHVH. He blessed YHVH for not forsaking His mercy and truth toward Abraham, and for being with him on the way and leading him to the house of his master's brethren.

Jacob told Rachel he was her father's relative and that he was Rebekah's son.

The Samaritan woman asked, "Are You greater than our father Jacob, who gave us the well, and drank from it himself, as well as his sons and his livestock?"

Yeshua answered and said to her, "Whoever drinks of this water will thirst again, but whoever drinks of the water that I shall give him will never thirst. But the water that I shall give him will become in him a fountain of water springing up into everlasting life."

The woman said to Him,
"Sir, give me this water, that
I may not thirst, nor come
here to draw."

He told her to call her husband. She said she didn't have one. He said you're right, the one you are with is not your husband.
She perceives he's a prophet so she asks which is the proper place to worship. He says a time is coming when true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and in truth.

She acknowledges that the Messiah is coming.
