This story shares similar themes with what happened with Saul of Tarsus.

Saul was **abusing** his own people by persecuting them. Yet he was really persecuting Yeshua.

Surely his way was **perverse** before YHVH.

YHVH had to strike him with blindness (opposition) to get him to eventually walk correctly.

Saul was struck only once, but his blindness lasted **3** days before Ananias came and laid hands on him. Something like scales fell from his eyes and he **received his sight**.

Saul intended to persecute God's people, but he became a chosen vessel of YHVH, a **messenger of YHVH**, to lead others to the Messiah, so they could experience **blessing instead of cursing.**
