Intro	Amos 1:1-2  The words of Amos, who was among the sheepbreeders of Tekoa, which he saw concerning Israel in the days of Uzziah king of Judah, and in the days of Jeroboam the son of Joash, king of Israel, two years before the earthquake. <sup>2</sup> And he said: "The LORD roars from Zion, And utters His voice from Jerusalem; The pastures of the shepherds mourn, And the top of Carmel withers."	Introduction: Amos was a sheepbreeder of Tekoa, which is about 6-7 miles from Jerusalem.  However, he ministered in the northern kingdom during the first half of the 8th century BCE.	
		In this first prophetic book of the Tanakh to be written, YHVH speaks to the nations from Jerusalem/Zion.	
	Each section begins with: Thus says the LORD: "For three transgressions of [LOCATION], and for four, I will not turn away its punishment,	Each nation will suffer punishment for the transgressions they committed. All nations but Israel, will suffer punishment by fire – including Judah.

A	Amos 7:10-11  10 Then Amaziah the priest of Bethel sent to Jeroboam king of Israel, saying, "Amos has conspired against you in the midst of the house of Israel. The land is not able to bear all his words.  11 "For thus Amos has said: 'Jeroboam shall die by the sword, And Israel shall surely be led away captive From their own land.'"	Amos 7:17  17 "Therefore thus says the LORD: 'Your wife shall be a harlot in the city; Your sons and daughters shall fall by the sword; Your land shall be divided by survey line; You shall die in a defiled land; And Israel shall surely be led away captive From his own land.'"	Jeroboam has a priest, Amaziah, in Beth El. Amaziah accuses Amos of conspiring against the king in Israel because Amos prophesied the death of Jeroboam by the sword and the captivity of Israel.  Amos told Amaziah that his wife would become a harlot in the city, his sons and daughters would die by the sword, that his land would be divided by survey line, and that he would die in a defiled land – the land he and others were responsible for defiling by their idolatry and other wickedness. This would be the cause of their being led into captivity.
